

#### You will need:

- A Four Panelled Door
- Masking Tape, or Painters Frog Tape (advisable – it's stronger)
- White, Pink, Purple and Yellow Emulsion Paint (suitable for wood/doors)
- Vinyl Sticker Paper
- Paint Roller
- Medium Paintbrush
- Smaller Detailer Paintbrush
  Craft Knife (preferably with a curved edge)

## STEP

Paint the door with two coats of white emulsion (ensure it is completely dry before beginning the next step.)





#### STEP 2

Before painting the ridges of the door pink, carefully apply masking tape to cover the areas you want to remain white, like so:







The curved areas around the top of the panels are quite tricky to mask off - so might take some time.






#### STEP3

Carefully apply thin layers of pink paint, ensuring it is completely dry between coats.



Once completely dry, gently peel off the tape. If any of the paint has bled underneath the tape you will need to touch up the paint with a very small paintbrush.



# STEP5

Print the flower images onto vinyl sticker paper (one large, one medium, and three small). You can find printable versions of these images on our website.



### STEP6

Use a craft knife to carefully cut out the centre of the flowers (don't throw the centres away).



Secure the back of the vinyl paper to the door and paint the centre circles yellow. For the best finish, paint in thin layers, waiting for the paint to dry fully between each coat.



#### STEP8

When the yellow paint is completely dry, cut out the rest of the flowers and attach the front of the vinyl paper to the door. Use the circles that are left from step six to cover the yellow centres.



#### STEP 9

Use the pink and purple paint to fill in the flowers. Again for the best finish, paint in thin layers, waiting for each layer to dry completely before starting the next.



# STEP 10

Once dry, gently peel back the vinyl paper and touch up any areas that have bled.



#### STEPTT

Wait for any finishing touches to dry and you're done! Hang in a little monster's room, but watch out for big monsters looking to collect screams (UK Oak Doors cannot be held responsible for visiting monsters, resulting screams, or children lost in Monstropolis).
